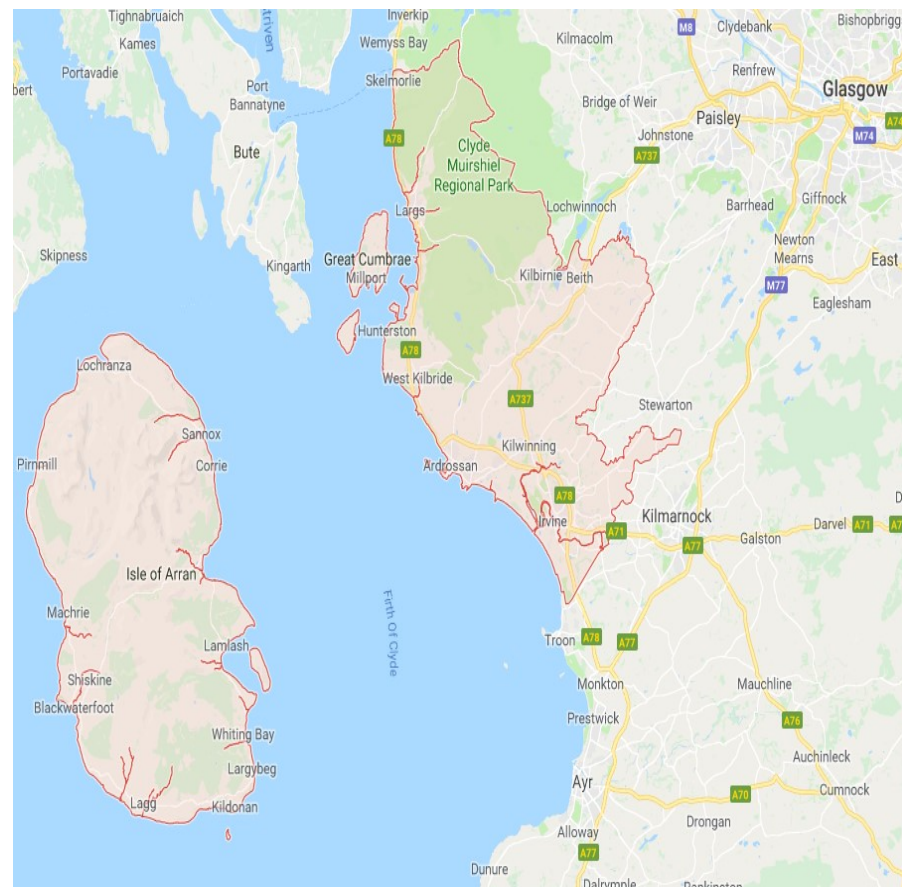

- 34.6% of North Ayrshire's data zones lie within the 20% most deprived data zones in Scotland
- Within North Ayrshire 27% of children live in poverty.
- Household Food Insecurity is a recognised problem
- The scale of the problem is unknown

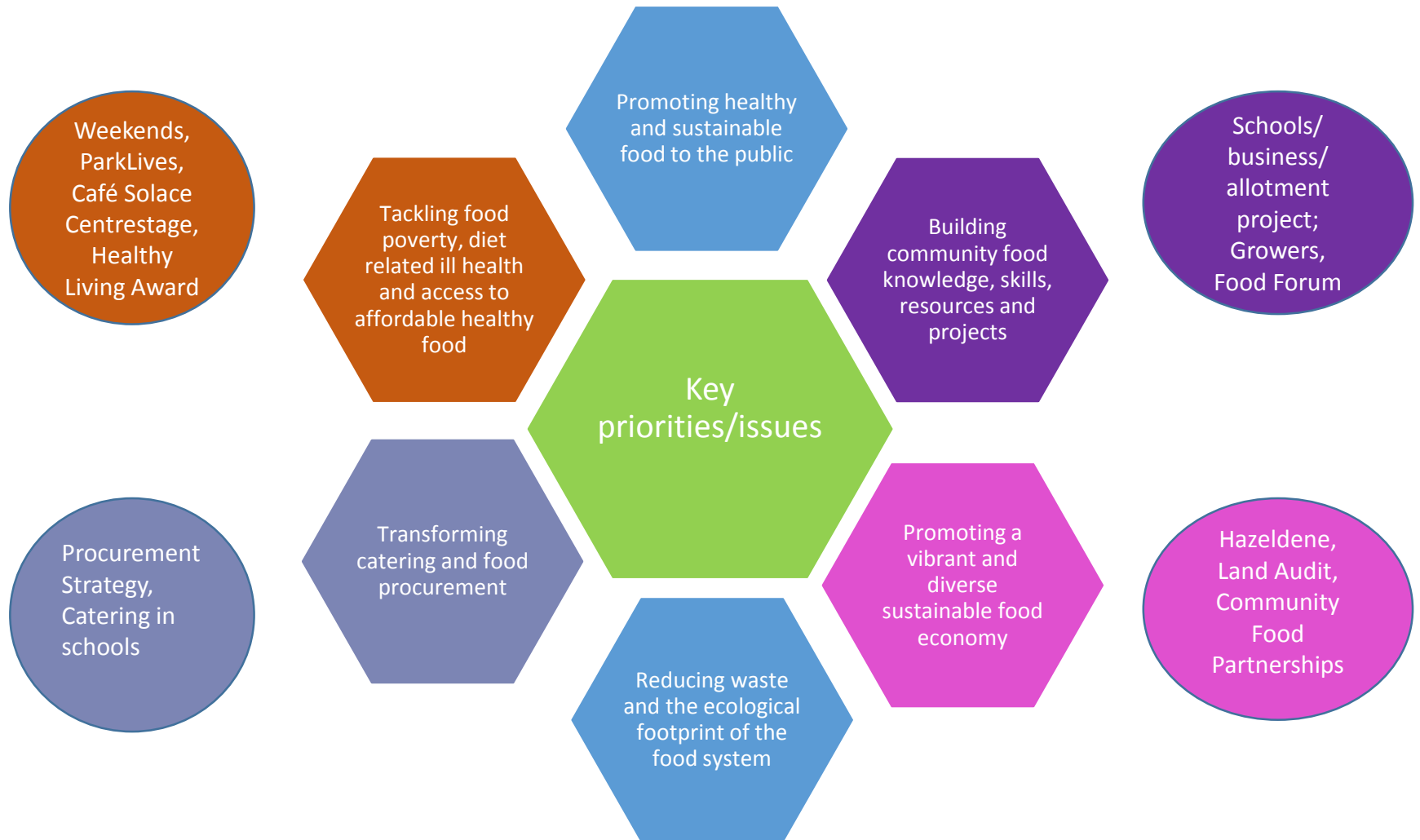
